Why do we reference?

Referencing is a way of giving credit to the people who have provided the information that you use in your work. It is a way of showing that you have done your research and that you are using reliable sources.

Referencing

When you use information from a source, you need to give credit to the source.

This is done by providing a reference for the source.

References are usually given in a list at the end of your work.

What parts of my work do I need to reference?

At Year 6, you need to reference **direct quotations**, which are words taken directly from a source.
